

Interfaith Community Conversations

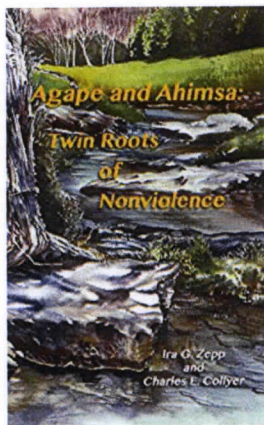
Come join us for an open dialogue about the commonalities and differences in various faith traditions. Our aim is to understand one another and build a stronger, more cohesive community in the Utica area!

New Hartford Public Library, Sammon Room

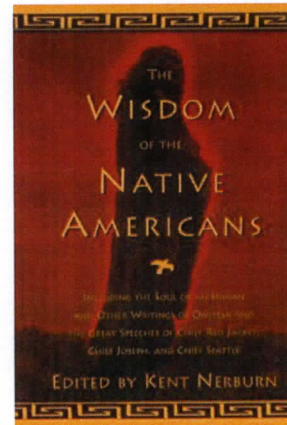

Whitesboro's Dunham Public Library, Community Room

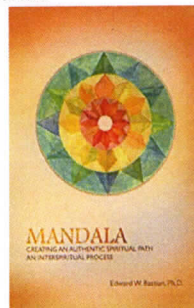
Facilitator Elisabeth Prenot will lead a discussion on *The Wisdom of Native Americans*, edited by Kent Nerburn
